The policy outlines a systematic approach for conducting regular assessments, ensuring transparency, uniformity, and academic integrity.

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POLICY/TORS FOR FEEDBACK ON BASIC SCIENCES TEACHING, CLINICAL SCIENCES TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT FROM STUDENTS OF **NMC**

Feedback for the Medical Educational Modules is needed periodically from undergraduate students which is essential to receive suggestions regarding any changes for progress of institutions.

One of the primary role for DME is to provide high quality procedures and practices to enhance the teaching, its learning and onward its assessment criteria and find out the problems faced by students.

In connection to this matter, DME is accountable for the overall synopsis of academic principles and values in limitations of medical teaching institution for improvement of such policies.

The outline of policy of module feedback is as under:

- The process of feedback will be online. The process of feedback will be through developed questionnaire encompasses all the related academic details in the last of each Block/Clinical studies.
- The feedback will be assessed by DME faculty and then will be shared with higher authorities, Dean, Vice Dean, Associate Dean (UGME) and all the related Head of Departments/Chairperson for any changes needed in the related studies or policies.
- A formal discussion will be made for any productive suggestions/Comments or any problems addressed by the students regarding any specific topic or module for enhancement.





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- All the related discussions minutes will be recorded by DME & hence forwarded to the Dean, Vice Dean, Associate Dean (UGME) and concerned Chairpersons for information. Furthermore, implementation orders will issued by the Chairperson DME to any specific Department or in general.
- Failure to any mutual agreed policy will be reported to concern the Chairperson/HoD and Dean for compliances.
- Any unresolved problem after institutional based practice, the problem will be addressed to the Governing authority Khyber Medical University, Peshawar through the Dean.
- The assessment feedback form will be completed by students at the end of each modular exam. The remaining forms will be filled out during the mentoring class held at the conclusion of each module, from first year to final year.

Following Faculty will assure the feedback from students:

- 1. Dr. Sobia Haris, Chairperson, Department of Medical Education will be responsible for overall supervision of module feedback.
- **2. Dr. Imran Zaman Khan**, Department of Medical Education, Focal Person for 4th and Final Year MBBS will be responsible for data collection from students on feedback proforma, data analysis and report writing of his respective classes i.e., 4th and Final Year MBBS.
- 3. Dr. Irum Taj, Department of Medical Education, Focal Person for 1st, 2nd & 3rd Year MBBS will be responsible for data collection from students on feedback proforma, data analysis and report writing of her respective classes i.e., 1st, 2nd & 3rd Year MBBS.

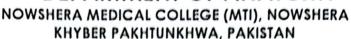

Policy/ Tors FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT/EXAMINATION

- Internal block assessment will be organized at the end of Block. There will be theory and OSPE after Block/Module completion. There will be 100-120 MCQS in theory paper and 90 MCQS in M1 and M2 theory paper. OSPE arrangement will be done through blue prints of KMU. OSCEs will be arranged at the end of academic year so to ensure all the batches has completed their clinical rotations.
- Annual Professional examination will be at the end of academic year. OSPE/OSCE and theory both will be conducted according to the structure of KMU, Peshawar.
- 3. MCQs and OSPE distribution is according to the blueprints of the KMU, Peshawar.
- 4. 10% weightage is for internal assessment according to KMU, Peshawar guideline.
- 5. All departments will share their related inputs according to the distributed portions allotted to them for theory and OSPE exams as per Blueprints.
- 6. MCQs required for each theory outline will be shared through the office of Chairperson/HoD Department of Medical Education to the focal persons of each department for timely submission of MCQS to cover the theory paper in time. The deadline will be at least two weeks for submission of MCQS before end of each Module.
- 7. Theory peper MCQs will be accumulated and compiled by the DME and before printing, a review of the theory paper will be conducted by DME from concerned departments through their subject specialist.
- 8. All the MCQs will be shared to KMU through their Official email address for annual examination by each department Chairperson/HoD or through nominated subject specialist, through Chairperson DME.
- 9. All blocks exams will be conducted under the supervision of DME. DME will be responsible for the conduction, invigilation and smooth procedure of examination. The departments will remain in contact with Chairperson/HoD DME for any query, changes, or specific matters. During the conduction of examination a focal person/representative from each department will perform his/her assign duty in exam hall. This will be for the purpose to ensure the transparent conduction of exam and to avoid any approach for cheating.

- 10. OSPE preparation will be finished one day prior by the faculty of all the concerned departments along with their support staff.
- 11. Each station will be allocated 3-4 minutes during OSPE.
- 12. One supportive staff/Class-iv will perform duty during each OSPE exam.
- 13. Each stations will be submitted in writing through single exam sheet.
- 14. All exam sheets will be dropped in drop boxes by the students.
- 15. Each station will be standardized with answer sheets approved by DME.
- 16. Instructions sheets will be displayed for the students at each station
- 17. Results will be accumulated by the concerned departments and will be shared with DME for further declaration for the students, faculty and KMU.
- 18. There is a total of 10 % internal assessment marks allocation for each block, Theory & Practical/Clinical Exams. Which is distributed for Theory as:
 - Attendance in Lectures: 3%
 - Block Examinations and Continuous assessments: 6%
 - Research: 1%
- 19. For OSPE/OSCE, it is distributed as:
 - Attendance in Practicals/Clinicals: 3%
 - Log Book: 1%
 - Block Examinations and Continuous assessments: 5%
 - Discipline, Attitude, Responsibility & Teamwork: 1%

- 21. Each block report regarding internal assessment is duty of the focal person from concerned department and Chairperson/HoD Medical Education.
- 22. Assembling of summative exam blocks paper and OSPE is primarily obligation of concerned department with mutual support from DME.
- 23. Each paper items analysis will be shared by DME with respective departments for quality enhancement.
- 24. In case of any grievances from students, a written application may be submitted by the concerned students to Chairperson DME which may be forwarded to KMU Peshawar as per need. If there is any rechecking/marking issue students will submit application for rechecking within three days after the announcement of the result.
- 25. There will be an end of a session-assessment meeting of Chairpersons/HoDs of concerned departments and Chairperson/HoD Medical Education will convene the said meeting and will discuss the feedback from faculty and students on the assessment.
- 26. Moreover, all papers will be handled with the utmost confidentiality by the ministerial staff responsible for writing, compilation, and printing. Each team member will strictly adhere to the protocols ensuring secrecy. Furthermore, all tasks will be supervised by the person to whom the duty is assigned by the Chairperson/HoD Medical Education from time to time. Moreover, he/she will oversee the process to guarantee that confidentiality and security are maintained at all times.
- 27. All students must adhere to the prescribed college uniform (NMC Prospectus Pg: 33-34) on exam days. No variations or modifications will be permitted.
- 28. Students without proper uniform will not be allowed to enter the Examination Hall.

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- 29. Any student found without the proper uniform in the Examination Hall will be fined Rs: 1000 per paper and will be taken out of Examination Hall.
- **30.** Students are required to arrive at least 10-15 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam. If not, then he/ she will be fined Rs: 1000 and will not be allowed to sit in exam.
- 31. Continuous disregard for uniform or punctuality rules may result in additional disciplinary actions.
- **32**. Any student found with a mobile phone or any other gadget or IT device in the examination hall will be fined Rs 5000 and his/her exam will be cancelled. Similarly, strict disciplinary action will be taken.
- **33**. Similarly, any student caught with printed or handwritten notes will be fined Rs. 1000.
- **34.** Furthermore, results will only be announced to students who have submitted their feedback forms related to the assessment.
- 35. The internal block exam will be rescheduled for students who had a supply exam on the day of internal exam. No other cases or requests will be considered.
